

Minutes of the Stamford Bridge Parish Council meeting held on Monday 11th October 2021 at 7.30 pm in the Methodist Church.

5. Public Participation Session (15 minutes information only)

Items discussed during the Public Session included;

Replacement of Christmas lighting scaffold poles
New battery for the PA system
The Government's ambition for cycling and walking in England.
Hedgehog signs
Car park entrance
New Mother and Baby classes at the Station Club
Sewage smells around Main Street/St Edmunds.

6. To confirm the Minutes of the meeting held on the 13th September 2021 (attached)
Proposed by Councillor Kealey as correct, seconded by Councillor Pope with all Councillors who attended the meeting voting in favour.

7. To discuss matters arising from previous Minutes

7.1 Update on ideas for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee

Councillor Pope updated the Councillors on his ideas for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations.

He has spoken to David Tinkler from the Arts Society to see if they would be interested in helping and given them the following brief;

The sign is to be about 1.5 m square, with the following;

On the left, a Viking warrior, looking right

On the right an Anglo-Saxon warrior, looking left

Between them a river flowing top to bottom of the sign, with a 3-arch bridge in the middle.

Over the top, crossed battle axes with 1066 beneath them.

Across the bottom STAMFORD BRIDGE GATEWAY TO THE EAST
RIDING OF YORKSHIRE

The sign will be sited near the Three Cups and will be installed by ERYC approved contractors.

7.2 Update from ERYC on the damage to the bridge following the lorry incident.

No further reports had been received from ERYC.

7.3 Update on the Car park signage and entrance

Councillor R Clarke reported that John Sellers had completed the stoning of the entrance.

The Clerk reported that the proofs for the signs to go up in the car park had been received, amended, and sent back to the printer.

7.4 Update from Councillors Kealey and Butterfield on new and repair of benches and also platform whitening

The only job still to be completed is the platform whitening, which has been held up due to the Contractor being unavailable.

7.5 Confirm grant for the Bowling Club (See attachment)

Councillor Kealey proposed that the Bowling Club was given the grant of £200.00. This was seconded by Councillor Pope with all Councillors in favour. Councillor Butterfield took no part in this item.

7.6 Update on the progress of the path between Stamford Bridge and High Catton.

The Chairman reported that he had spoken to Catton Parish Council Chairman and Stamford Bridge Parish Council have been asked if two Councillors can attend the next meeting of Catton Parish Council on Thursday 4th November. Councillors Kealey and C Clarke agreed to attend.

7.7 Discuss the purchase and installation of hedgehog signs following a meeting with Paul Palmer ERYC.

The Clerk reported that he had met with Paul Palmer from ERYC along with Jill Key. Paul and Jill had looked at six sites for the signs, Paul will speak to Highways and confirm if these sites can be used.

If all approved there will be a total of 6 signs at a cost of £360, not including posts. The signs suggested are the same ones used by the University of York. A maximum cost of £500.00 was proposed by Councillor Pope, seconded by Councillor Butterfield with all Councillors present in agreement.

8. To consider Planning Application as listed below

8a. Stamford Bridge Primary School Juniors Church Road - STAMFORD BRIDGE CONSERVATION AREA - Fell 1 no. Lime tree due to the tree growing too large for the land space it occupies and branches are falling into the neighbour's garden and onto the school's flat roof - causing blockages in the guttering/spouting and water blockages.

Recommended for approval – with replacement tree to be planted within the same area.

8b. 19 Church Road - Construction of a vehicular access

This application was approved but with concerns expressed about the safety issue of a vehicle pulling into the space and reversing out, when parked vehicles are likely to be either side of the space and children often use the pavement on their route to the local school. Church Road is also a fairly busy road and reversing in or out with likely obstructions on either side would be a safety hazard.

8c. Italdo, 2 High Catton Road - Erection of two storey extensions to side and rear, erection of a first-floor extension, construction of a replacement dormer to front, construction of canopy to side, installation of roof lights, installation of new and replacement of windows, doors, fascia's and barge boards, installation of timber cladding and application of render to walls above plinth level
Recommended for approval.

8d. Application Number: 21/30310/CONDET - Land to the West of HM Prison Full Sutton Moor Lane Full Sutton East Riding of Yorkshire YO41 1PS
Proposal: Submission of details required by Conditions 8 (means of disposal of foul and surface water drainage for the whole site) and 9 (piped discharge of surface water from the application site) of planning permission 18/04105/STOUT.

No further comments.

Items 8a, b, c and d proposed by Councillor Pope and seconded by Councillor Kealey with all Councillors in favour.

9. To note planning decisions by East Riding of Yorkshire Council

9a. The Co-operative Food 4, The Square - Display of 1 internally illuminated fascia sign, 3 non-illuminated fascia signs, 1 externally illuminated hanging sign, and 1 non-illuminated faux window sign.

9b. 45 Wyles Way - Erection of an outbuilding to the rear

ERYC has resolved to grant planning permission on items 9a and 9b.

10. To approve accounts for the 1st to 30th September 2021 (see attachment)

a) To confirm that accounts totalling £2,486.26 paid out during September 2021.

b) To note the end of month bank balance on the 30th September 2021 as - £113,992.44

c) To note amounts paid in during September 2021– £29,000 (Precept)

RESOLVED: a, b, & c proposed as correct by Councillor Kealey and seconded by Councillor Butterfield with all Councillors in favour.

11. Request for a Christopher Wharton Educational Foundation Representative.

Councillor Shuttleworth was formally proposed by Councillor Pope to be a Council representative on the Christopher Wharton Educational Foundation. This was seconded by Councillor R Clarke with all Councillors in favour.

12. Discuss siting an EV charger in Viking Road car park-comments required by ERYC. (See attachment)

The Clerk had sent the Councillors the following letter from Dean Edwards-Engineer, Traffic and Parking for ERYC.

“ERYC’s Flood Risk Management Team consider that siting the EV charger on the south side of the main car park minimises the flood risk as that side of the car park is higher than the opposite side.

This view is reflected by the Council’s Area Highway Engineer who agrees that the south side would minimise the flood risk, adding that siting the charge point on the slightly raised grass bank would further minimise flood risk.

The Environment Agency state that although there are historic records of flooding the adjacent defences have been built since then.

The Agency agree that siting the EV charger on the slightly higher south side of the car park would offer protection in cases of extreme events that could lead to overtopping and hence minimises the flood risk.

They also agree that if possible, raising the charge point post perhaps by mounting on a raised plinth would further minimise the flood risk.

In view of the above, I would be pleased to receive the Parish Councils comments on the proposal and look forward to hearing from you after the next meeting.”

The Councillors agreed that the main car park was the ideal location, but would require further EV chargers.

13. Report of a sewage odours near the crossing to St Edmunds on the A166.

Ward Councillor Kay West had emailed to say that Ward Councillor McMaster who is the portfolio holder for environment will look into this issue.

14. Update on Remembrance Day, Christmas Light switch on and Yule Fest.

The Clerk reported that all paperwork for the Remembrance Day had been received by ERYC, the Christmas Light switch on was going ahead with just lights going up in the Square. Councillor Shuttleworth was arranging the Christmas poster competition for the school children to enter, Xandor Automotive would once again sponsor the competition with a £10 prize for each class winner.

The Councillors also agreed to spend a maximum of £500.00 on scaffold poles for The Shallows lighting and a new battery for the PA system.

Also approved was a grant for £1000.00 towards Yule Fest which is taking place on the 5th December, proposed by Councillor R Clark and seconded by Councillor Pope with four Councillors in favour and one against.

This grant could be reduced to £500.00 if a grant from ERYC is received.

15. Co-op update regarding the asbestos and car parking signage.
Councillor R Clarke reported that the Co-op have agreed to supply two signs showing the free parking areas within Stamford Bridge, He felt that the Council needed to design the signs and then we would be able to tell the Co-op the specifications and agree sign positions with ERYC.

16. Update on the diversion of the path off Main Street

Councillor Pope reported that ERYC are going to revise the signage on the public rights of way in the vicinity of 48 – 52 Main Street, and suggested that this matter be considered closed and not to be included in future agendas.

17. Update on the Tapestry Group AGM, attended by Councillors R Clarke and C Kealey

Councillors, R Clarke and Kealey had attended the tapestry AGM along with the Clerk.

The meeting asked if the Parish Council would take over as Trustees of the tapestry and arrange insurance.

Councillor R Clarke felt before anything could happen the Tapestry Group had to decide amongst themselves where they wanted the tapestry to be held and/or replace the tapestry with high-definition pictures of each section, which would then enable the tapestry to be shown in different locations and allow them to

place the originals in a safe store .This would help determine the cost of insurance.

18. The Parish Council have been asked to fund the trial setting up of a mother and baby/toddler group.
Councillor Pope proposed giving a grant of £60.00 towards the trial setting up of the group in the Station Club.
This was seconded by Councillor Kealey with all Councillors in favour.
