A166 Highway Improvements, Stamford Bridge

Work is due to commence on improvements to the A166 between the County boundary and St Edmunds within the village of Stamford Bridge. The works form part of a larger scheme of improvement works along the A166 which also includes resurfacing at Garrowby Hill and a further section of resurfacing west of Fridaythorpe. The £1,900,000 scheme will be carried out by CEMEX UK on behalf of the Council, with funding secured from the Local Enterprise Partnership. In addition to this Viking Road in Stamford Bridge will be resurfaced with funding from East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

The Stamford Bridge works will commence on 5 February with 5 weeks of carriageway resurfacing Mon-Fri between the hours of 19.00 and midnight when traffic flows are lower. Due to narrow road widths the evening works will be carried out under convoy traffic control to keep vehicle speeds down and work will be carried out in short sections in order to allow the completion of each section within the short working hours. Some daytime works may also take place for minor operations requiring minimal traffic control, such as repairing gully and manhole covers.

In order to facilitate the works safely Buttercrambe Road, Viking Road and Church Road will be closed when the contractor is working in the vicinity of these junctions, only one junction will be closed on any one evening shift.

On completion of the A166 works in Stamford Bridge, work will commence on Viking Road to replace the failed concrete road and improve the footways and kerbing. Further information will be issued closer to the start of this section of works.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council would like to apologise in advance for any inconvenience that these works may cause.
