

Minutes of Stamford Bridge Parish Council meeting held on Monday 14th September 2015 at 7.30 pm in the back room of the Village Hall.

1. To receive apologies for absence.

4.1 Humberside Police

Humberside Police were unable to attend due to shift patterns, but asked if the latest Pocklington Bulletin could be given to members of the public.

4.2 East Riding of Yorkshire Ward Councillor

Councillor Lane had nothing to report, but the Chairman asked for a meeting with him regarding the Planning application 14/01771/STOUT at Burtonfields Barns for change of use to a sports pitch.

- 5 To confirm the Minutes of the meeting held on the 10th August 2015 as a true and correct record.

RESOLVED: (All in favour) that the Minutes of the meeting held on the 10th August 2015 are a true and correct record.

Proposed by Councillor Clarke and seconded by Councillor Butterfield with all Councillors who attended the meeting voting in favour.

- 6 To discuss matters arising from previous Minutes:

- 6.1 ERYC Health Check-to discuss if a visit by the health care bus is required following advice from the Doctors at Stamford Bridge Surgery as to whether they feel there would be benefit in going ahead.

After a short discussion the Councillors decided against inviting the Health-care bus to Stamford Bridge as it might have a detrimental effect on the future services that the surgery may wish to apply for.

It was suggested that the ERYC letter was passed to Catton Parish Council as they may wish to apply.

- 6.2 Investigate ways of eliminating the mud on the pedestrian bridge from the riverside walks following a site visit by the Councillors.

As the site meeting was cancelled this item has been moved to the October Agenda.

- 6.3 To hear a report from Councillors Kealey on the planned meeting of the defibrillator interested parties to discuss a way forward that would benefit all residents of Stamford Bridge.

Councillor Kealey reported that he was looking to arrange a meeting:-

- 1 With all interested parties.
- 2 Try and get first responders up and running
- 3 Target organizations in the village.

- 6.4 To discuss the Sustrans path as a “dogs on lead” area following a complaint by a resident.

Councillors Clarke and Bragg are to attend a meeting organized by the ERYC dog section, when they will try and obtain further information on which areas are “dogs on leads” and which areas allow “dogs off leads”.

- 7 To report and make relevant recommendations on new planning applications and subsequent plans received after the Agenda is sent out:

- 7.1. 2 Moor Road - Erection of detached garage

The Parish Council recommend refusal of this application as they have concerns regarding the scale and the impact of this proposal.

The Parish Council is aware of new plans that are to be submitted which may enable the Council to approve at a future meeting.

7.2 2 Moor Road – TPO - Birch with stem wound at 3 metres - reduce damaged stem by 3 metres; Pine with stem wound at 3 metres - reduce damaged stem by 3 metres; Pine and Birch to suppressed form, Group of Pine trees remove dead wood.

The Council had no comment to make due to the technical nature of other work taking place.

7.3 11 Garrowby View - Erection of double garage

The Council had no comments to make upon this application, but would agree with the concerns raised by Highway Control.

7.4 8 Foresters Walk - Erection of first floor extension to side and single storey extension to rear.

Recommended for approval

7.5 Beech Lodge 20A Church Road - Beech tree; crown lift to 5 metres to first 4 branches, further branches higher a reduction by 30%, Copper Beech; crown by 5 metres, Beech tree; removal of lower limb overhanging boundary.

9 The Chairman congratulated Village in Bloom for winning the Gold Award 2015 and a surprise discretionary Community Award. Congratulations to the Cricket Club for being promoted to the new Yorkshire Premier League for next season. He was saddened to hear about the accident in the Square, which continues to be a dangerous car park. Due to further problems with the buses he asked the Clerk to invite David Boden from ERYC Transport Department to the next meeting and to advise

First York that the Council was very unhappy that First York did not consult the Council before implementing the changes.

The Clerk was requested to put contact details for the Parish Council on the Notice Boards.

The Clerk had sent his report to members of the Parish Council, but read it out for members of the public.

It was proposed by Councillor Clarke that a max of £100.00 was spent on the purchase of bushes. This was seconded by Councillor Bragg with all Councillors in favour.

13.2 To approve expenditure for the purchase of spring bulbs to be planted in the Community Orchard by the children of the school.

After a short discussion it was agreed to spend a maximum of £100.00 on spring bulbs for the children to plant in the Community Orchard.

This was proposed by Councillor Bragg and seconded by Councillor Clarke with all Councillors in favor.

13.3 To approve amendments to the Archiving Policy and Freedom of Information act for the monthly minutes to be left on the Stamford Bridge Parish Council web site for a maximum of two years.

Councillor Rutherford proposed acceptance to the amendments of the Archiving Policy and Freedom of Information Act to allow the Minutes of the meetings to be left on the website for two years.

This was seconded by Councillor Butterfield with all Councillors in favour.
